

WWTF | Key facts

- Private/public non-profit research funder in Austria
- > Since 2002: approx. € 265 Mio in funding (private foundation, City of Vienna)
- ► Funding per year: €15-17 Mio.
- WWTF's mission:
 - ► Funding top scientific research in Vienna
 - Providing substantial funding for larger research projects and international research group leaders coming to Vienna
 - Running competitive calls according to highest international standards



About WE&ME



- WE&ME, formerly known as 'Tempi Foundation,' was founded in 2020 by the Ströck family in Vienna.
- The family has been directly affected since 2016, with 2 sons being ME/CFS patients, leading to the recognition of a shortage of ME/CFS professionals and a lack of awareness and support.
- In August 2023, WE&ME was relaunched and has since raised around 150k in donations.
- Gerhard and Gabriele Ströck have invested approximately 1.5 million in ME/CFS research and projects so far.

- Building a better support and care system for ME/CFS patients
- Awareness

- Project up to 100,000 €
- Duration: 12 15 months
- Timeline
 - Call Start: March 2024
 - Proposal deadline: 18. June 2024 2pm
 - Jury Meeting: September 2024
 - Funding decision: October 2024
 - Project Start: <u>latest 01/2025</u>

ME/CFS 24 | Scope of call



"This is a call for small exploratory research projects that address fundamental research questions to advance understanding of post-acute infectious diseases such as ME/CFS. The aim of this call is to generate preliminary data."

ME/CFS24 | Scope of call I

- Advance our understanding of etiopathogenesis, diagnostics and/or therapy of post-acute infectious diseases, namely ME/CFS.
- All disciplines invited, especially from
 - clinical research
 - (bio)medical research
 - computer sciences
- Highly welcome are projects that
 - push the state of the art
 - bring together experimental & clinical approaches (Translational)
 - bring together approaches from different scientific disciplines (Interdisciplinary)

ME/CFS24 | Scope of call II



- Phenotypic Characteristics: The definition of ME/CFS must be based on either of these international consensus criteria
 - Canadian Consensus Criteria (CCC) or the revised CCC
 - International Consensus Criteria
 - NICE Guidelines for ME/CFS
 - IOM 2015 Diagnostic Criteria
- ▶ Other post-acute infectious diseases can also be investigated as part of the projects. Post-exertional malaise needs to be a decisive inclusion criterion for the post-acute infectious disease to be investigated, e.g. Long Covid
- Please note that solely observational projects in clinical settings and health service research do not fit the scope of this call

ME/CFS24 | Interdisciplinarity

w|w|T|F

- Meaningful interdisciplinary projects are strongly encouraged
 - Keep in mind: interdisciplinarity is a team effort!
- Expertise may be within the same research group, traverse research groups or institutions

Evaluation Process



Formal check by WWTF Office

- Online submission until 18. June 2pm
- All required signatures from respective institutions (PI&C, Copi & partner organisations)

Jury meeting in September (4-6 international Jury members)

- Assessment by at least two jury members prior to meeting
- Discussion of all proposals within scope
- Funding recommendation by international expert jury

Formal decision in October

- WWTF boards formally confirms jury recommendation
- Information of applicants about decision



Evaluation Criteria



- Scope ... as described in the call specifications. Projects which are not within the thematic scope will be immediately rejected by the jury
- Scientific quality, novelty to generate preliminary data & interdisciplinarity
 - Scientific excellence and academic potential of the applicant(s)
 - Innovative character of the proposed research project
 - Team composition and interdisciplinary collaboration
- Further criteria include relevance and academic & clinical impact, feasibility of the proposed project plan, Data management and Gender aspects.



WWTF | Open Science Policy



WWTF aims to:

- fund research guided by principle "as open as possible, as closed as necessary"
- provide funds related to the cost of OA publication and data management
- place more emphasis on Open Data by adoption of FAIR principles

WWTF | Data Management

w|w|T|F

- Brief explanation regarding how data and/or code generated in project will be managed and made available
- ➤ We strongly encourage to develop a data management plan in your project (Note: if your project will be funded, details will be discussed during contracting)
 - Documentation and metadata that accompanies data
 - ► Ethical and legal aspects
 - Process to store, preserve and share data

WWTF | Gender Equality Plan

WWTF:

- Encourages gender-balanced teams and more female researchers to apply as PIs of research projects
- Uses evaluation criteria that account for career breaks
- Strives for gender balance in jury panels and reviewer pools
- For more details, see WWTF's Gender Equality Plan

Applicants:

- Consider gender and specific roles in research team composition
- Address sex and/or gender in research content
- Can include Childcare and / or career coaching costs to the budget
- See "Gender aspects in the application phase" in Call Specifications

ME/CFS24 | Teams & Budget



- Up to 3 researchers per project in core team
 - ► Coordinating PI: must be affiliated to a Viennese research institution
 - ► Co-PIs: can be based worldwide
- Partner institutions can also be involved in the project (no profit-oriented companies allowed)
- Up to 30% total budget may be allocated outside of Vienna
- ▶ Non-personnel costs should not exceed 40% of the overall budget
- For this call, we do not pay overheads

<u>Important: Max. 2 proposals per researcher (as Core Team member)</u>

Joint Projects



- Collaborations between researchers from Vienna and Lower Austria
 - Coordinating PI: affiliated to a Viennese research institution
 - Co-PI: at least one based in Lower Austria
- Budget
 - ➤ Total funding volume also 100,000€
 - ➤ Vienna: Min. 51% Budget
 - Lower Austria: 30% 49% Budget
 - ▶ Optional: Other partners up to 30% Budget

Things to Consider



- Check the scope of our call, careful reading
- Get to know your institution's research office
- ➤ Read the guidelines → Evaluation criteria (Call Specs)
- Don't assume specific expertise of our Jury
- Polish your CV, use our template
- Pay more than lip service to gender equality & open science
- Think realistically about the budget of your project (feasibility!)





WWTF Funding Portal



- ▶ New Funding Portal launched in 2022
 - ▶ Old Submission System will be phased out

WWTF Funding Portal | What's new?



- ► All core team members can contribute to and edit proposal
 - Only coordinating PI can submit proposal
- External parties can create a proposal and invite core team members (e.g. project managers)
- Personal information is managed independently of proposals and can be reused across proposals
- Signatures from core team members no longer necessary
 - Authorising signatures from institutes & partner institutions required
 - ▶ Please check with your grant service early: "Who needs to sign my proposal?"


WWTF Funding Portal | Steps to submission



- Register or login
- Choose call and create proposal
- Invite coordinating PI and co-PIs
- Complete "My Profile" and "My Roles"
- ► Chapters to fill out
 - 1. Basic information
 - 2. Personnel and institutions
 - 3. Project
- Submit proposal (only possible by coordinating PI)

Proposal | Project



- **1.** Lay summary (1,000 characters)
- **2. Scientific abstract** (2,000 characters)
- **3. Work programme:** Please use the template provided. The headings in bold are mandatory (max. 8 pages including figures)
 - Introduction and State-of-the-art
 - 2. Innovativeness and original contribution
 - 3. Research questions, objectives and/or hypotheses
 - 4. Methodological approaches and workplan
 - 5. Expected outcomes and potential next research steps
 - 6. Project team and interdisciplinary collaboration
 - References
- **4. Ethical considerations** (500 characters)
- **5. Data Management** (500 characters)
- → Gender aspects should be considered throughout and explained where appropriate

Ethics

An acknowledgement of receipt from the ethics committee/institutional review board must be submitted with the proposal.

<u>The final approval ("Votum") must be submitted to WWTF</u> the latest before project start.


Proposal | Budget



- Basic Information
- Personnel and Institutions
- Project
- Budget
- Signatures
- ► Personnel + non-personnel costs = total costs
- No overhead costs for this call
- Salaries ≥ minimum wage according to Kollektivvertrag or FWF standards
 - https://www.fwf.ac.at/en/research-funding/personnel-costs
- Non-personnel costs should not exceed 40% of total budget
- ► No funding of companies or industry partners
 - Self-funded business partners are possible (→ need to bring in money or in-kind)
- Budget allocated outside of Vienna up to 30% of total budget

Proposal | Budget





- Institutions of core team members and partner institutes added automatically
- Cost distributions are automatically checked and verified
- Provide brief explanation of cost planning (1000 characters)


Proposal | Signatures



- ► Signatures from core team members no longer necessary
- Signatures from authorising persons at institutions of core team members & partner institutions required
 - Check with research support, grant offices, etc.
 - Allow ample time
- Signature sheet can be generated once the project title and core team members' institutes have been entered
- All signature forms are accepted
